Naomi Easley Moore, Texas prisoner # 581658, appeals from the district court's judgment denying her "Petition for Exhumation." This court remanded the case to the district court for a determination whether Moore tendered for filing any document within the time allowed by Fed. R. App. P. 4 that meets the notice requirements of Fed. R. App. P. 3. The district court thereafter entered an order in which it determined that Moore had

not filed any document that could serve as a timely notice of appeal. Moore does not challenge that determination. In light of the district court's determination on remand that Moore did not file a timely notice of appeal from the district court's final judgment, this appeal is DISMISSED for lack of appellate jurisdiction.
