PER CURIAM:*

Jose Flores Lopez appeals the district court's order denying release pending his trial on several charges of conspiracy, bribery, issuing false documents, and transporting illegal aliens, violations of 8 U.S.C. § 1324, 18 U.S.C. § 1546, and 18 U.S.C. § 201. In light of the evidence adduced before the magistrate judge and district judge, Lopez has neither shown that the trial court was clearly erroneous in

its findings of fact, nor that it abused its discretion in ordering him detained pending trial.¹ The detention order is AFFIRMED.
