PER CURIAM:*

Arthur John Miller ("Miller"), federal inmate #88057-020, appeals the district court's dismissal of his civil rights suit filed pursuant to Bivens v. Six Unknown Named Agents of Fed. Bureau of Narcotics, 403 U.S. 388 (1971). Miller argues that the defendants violated his constitutional rights when he was unjustly placed on Inmate Financial Responsibility Program Refuse status. Miller alleges that his prison status affected his prison privileges and eligibility for certain jobs.

The district court did not err in dismissing Miller's complaint as frivolous because Miller failed to demonstrate any constitutional violations. See *Bulger v. United States Bureau of Prisons*, 65 F.3d 48, 49-50 (5th Cir. 1995); see also *McGhee v. Clark*, 166 F.3d 884, 886 (7th Cir. 1999).

The decision of the district court is AFFIRMED.
