Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Jose Marcos Escobar-Torres raises an argument that he concedes is foreclosed by *United States v. Guerrero-Navarro*, 737 F.3d 976 (5th Cir. 2013), in which this court held that “Washington’s Residential Burglary offense, WASH. REV. CODE ANN. § 9A.52.025, constitutes the enumerated generic crime of burglary of a dwelling” and a crime of violence for purposes of U.S.S.G. § 2L1.2(b)(1)(A).
