The attorney appointed to represent Huey Joseph Hebert, III, has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief in accordance with *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), and *United States v. Flores*, 632 F.3d 229 (5th Cir. 2011). Hebert has filed a response in which he argues, inter alia, that his appellate counsel rendered ineffective assistance by asserting that Hebert's appeal waiver is enforceable.

We have reviewed counsel's brief and the relevant portions of the record reflected therein, as well as Hebert's response. We concur with counsel's assessment that the appeal presents no nonfrivolous issue for appellate review. We decline to consider Hebert's ineffective assistance of counsel claim, without prejudice to collateral review. *See United States v. Isgar*, 739 F.3d 829, 841 (5th Cir. 2014).

Accordingly, the motion for leave to withdraw is GRANTED, counsel is excused from further responsibilities herein, and the APPEAL IS DISMISSED. *See* 5th Cir. R. 42.2.
