PER CURIAM:*

Samuel Ojo Adetiba challenges the district court's dismissal of his habeas petition which requested the lowering of his bond or release on his own recognizance pending the deportation proceedings. This Court affirmed the order of deportation. See Adetiba v. Immigration & Naturalization Serv., No. 92-4653 (5th Cir. Oct. 6, 1993) (unpublished). Adetiba has been deported. Because the habeas relief that Adetiba requests can no longer be
