PER CURIAM:*

We are unable to discern any constitutional violation at all in the vague, rambling complaints that appellant Thompson has asserted against various Corpus Christi state officers and local agencies. The magistrate judge gave him ample opportunity to clarify his allegations. He has not done so. The appeal is dismissed as frivolous.
