PER CURIAM:*

Benjamin Manuel Rencoret argues that the district court erred by denying his 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion because his conviction was the result of a conspiracy; his trial violated principles of due process; and his attorney performed ineffectively by failing to impeach an informant, present allegedly exculpatory evidence, and inspect a tape introduced into evidence. Rencoret further argues that counsel allowed a law clerk to perfect Rencoret's appeal.

Having reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and finding no reversible error, we AFFIRM. Rencoret's motion to correct errors in his appellate brief is GRANTED; his motion to supplement the record is DENIED AS MOOT.
