PER CURIAM:*

After several "unacceptable" performance ratings resulting in the ultimate termination of his employment by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, English sued Louis Freeh, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Janet M. Reno, Attorney General of the United States, James C. Carter, E. Michael Kahoe, the Department of

Justice, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the United States of America claiming violations of the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 *et seq.*, the Whistle-Blower Protection Act, 5 U.S.C. § 1201-1222, *et seq.*, the Rehabilitation Act, 29 U.S.C. § 791, *et seq.*, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e, *et seq.* and the Louisiana Civil Code, alleging theories of discrimination because of his race (white), retaliation for particular conduct and discrimination based on his own erroneous perception that he was handicapped. English had previously sought relief from the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and from the Merit System Protection Board unsuccessfully.

We have carefully reviewed the briefs, the record excerpts and relevant portions of the record itself. For the reasons thoroughly discussed and analyzed in the district judge's Order and Reasons entered under the date of April 22, 1994, we AFFIRM the judgment of the district court dismissing English's complaint with prejudice.
