claims. Simmons' primary response to the evidence that supported the defendants' motion for summary judgment was a need for more discovery. However, he did not indicate what this discovery would reveal nor how this information would contradict the defendants' evidence. Because the defendants were entitled to judgment as a matter of law, the judgment of the district court is affirmed.
