PER CURIAM:*

Rine argues that she was denied her constitutional right to equal protection because she was selectively prosecuted based on her race. Appellant cannot raise this issue. She pleaded guilty unconditionally, thereby waiving all nonjurisdictional defects. United States v. Bell, 966 F.2d 914, 915 (5th Cir. 1992). Her appeal is without arguable merit and is dismissed as frivolous. 5th Cir. R. 42.2.
