PER CURIAM:*

Jesus Mauricio Griego was convicted of conspiracy, carjacking, and use of a firearm during and in relationship to a crime of violence. The district court sentenced Griego to concurrent sentences for the conspiracy and carjacking convictions and a consecutive sentence for the firearms offense. Griego's sentences do not violate principles of double jeopardy. See United States v. Singleton, 16 F.3d 1419, 1423-28 (5th Cir. 1994); United States v. Gonzales, 40 F.3d 735, 738 and n.6 (5th Cir. 1994), cert. denied, 115 S. Ct. 1716 (1995).
