PER CURIAM:\*

Ruben Rivera-Pastrana appeals his conviction for transporting undocumented aliens within the United States, in violation of 8 U.S.C. § 1324(a)(1)(A)(ii). Rivera argues that the district court erred in denying his motion to suppress because the United States Border Patrol agents lacked reasonable suspicion to justify the stop of his vehicle. We have reviewed the record and find no

reversible error. Accordingly, the judgment is AFFIRMED for essentially the reasons stated by the district court in its order denying the motion to suppress. See United States v. Rivera-Pastrana, No. L-95-160 (S.D. Tx. Oct. 13, 1995).
