PER CURIAM:\*

Margaret Cole appeals the judgment affirming the decision of the Commissioner of Social Security denying her claim for Supplemental Security Income. She contends that the Commissioner failed to apply the correct legal standards and that his decision was not supported by substantial evidence.

The Commissioner's decision reflects that the Commissioner applied the proper legal standards in denying benefits to Cole.

See *Ripley v. Chater*, 67 F.3d 552, 555 (5th Cir. 1995). Based on our review of the record and the briefs of the parties, we find no reversible error. Accordingly, we **AFFIRM** the judgment for essentially the reasons stated by the district court. See *Cole v. Callahan*, No. SA-96-CA-1164 (W.D. Tex. July 24, 1997).
