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MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a *pro se* litigant, has filed a judicial misconduct complaint regarding a district court matter presided over by the subject United States District Judge, and an unrelated appeal presided over by the three subject United States Circuit Judges. Complainant complains: "I paid all filing fees. Was not called to Court but once. Was not appointed a lawyers [sic]."

These allegations relate directly to the merits of the judges' decisions, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.
