MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a federal prisoner, complains that despite explicitly advising the court of his Reservation of Rights, and the publication of same in a county newspaper, the subject United States Magistrate Judge failed to dismiss the indictment, violated complainant's due process rights, subjected him to "cruel and unusual punishment by detaining me and also not giving me a bond," and "exhibit[ed] powers not given to the United States by the U.S. Constitution."

The allegations relate directly to the merits of the magistrate judge's decisions, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
