M E M O R A N D U M

Complainant, a state prisoner, complains that in denying his 28 U.S.C. § 2254 application, the three subject United States Circuit Judges erroneously “made it appear my claims were ruled on” by the district court, “refus[ed] to cite any laws or give any sensible arguments,” intentionally violated complainant’s constitutional rights to due process and equal protection of the law, and violated their oaths of office.

The allegations relate directly to the merits of the judges’ decision, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
