## MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by the three subject United States Circuit Judges in complainant's appeal.

A review of the appellate record shows that in January 2024, the judges denied complainant's motion to proceed in forma pauperis on appeal, dismissed the appeal as frivolous, and denied all other outstanding motions. In February 2024, the judges denied complainant's petition for rehearing and motion to reopen the case.

Complainant alleges that the judges "perverted justice by lying and saying the case was fake after making timely appeals. There is "no answer" by the attorney. They are racist and believe they can break the law they make because of their "white skin.""

To the extent that complaint relates directly to the merits of decisions or procedural rulings, it is subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, any assertion of racism appears entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegation is separate, it is wholly unsupported, and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) as "lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred."

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
