MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a state prisoner, alleges that in affirming the district court's adverse judgment, the three subject United States Circuit Judges: "intentionally overlooked/ignored the sufficiency of the evidence and applied the incorrect precedents and [misapplied] the facts of the case for the benefit of [attorneys of the state Attorney General's Office]"; "refus[ed] to rule on [my] five points of statements of issue for appellate review presented"; and engaged in "conduct prejudicial to the pro se litigant by permitting the Attorney General's Office to litigate in bad faith against a pro se prisoner in a civil rights case."

To the extent that these allegations relate directly to the merits of the decisions or procedural rulings, they are subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, any assertion of bias appears entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegation is separate, it is wholly unsupported and is subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) as "lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred."

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
