John E. Scott, Texas prisoner # 756455, seeks to proceed in forma pauperis (IFP) on appeal following the district court's denial of his IFP motion for an appeal of the dismissal of his civil rights complaint. Scott fails to challenge the reasons for the district court's denial of the IFP motion, and he fails to show that his appeal has arguable merit and would be taken in

good faith. See Brinkman v. Dallas County Deputy Sheriff Abner, 813 F.2d 744, 748 (5th Cir. 1987); Jackson v. Dallas Police Dep't, 811 F.2d 260, 261 (5th Cir. 1986); 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(3). His motion to proceed IFP on appeal is DENIED, and his appeal is DISMISSED. See 5TH CIR. R. 42.2.
